In addition, resolutions amending Ordinance #63 of March 9, 1977, as well as the resolution dated September 9, 1981, which established new stop streets, one-way streets, yield streets, no parking areas and weight limits on certain roads, are hereby incorporated in this consolidation and revision Ordinance.

Providing for the regulation of vehicles on public roads, through traffic control signs, including emergency measures, prohibiting parking on certain roads, establishing minimum standards for roadways and drainageways, prohibiting obstructions to roadways, drainageways or pedestrian access during construction, and at other times, requiring permits to open streets or roadways and for new points of access, designating persons responsible for enforcement of such regulations and providing for remedies to correct violations of provisions contained herein.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Daugherty Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania that from and after the passage of this ordinance, the regulations contained herein shall be in full force and effect and shall be held to be the minimum requirements for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of persons residing or working within the municipal boundaries of Daugherty Township.

2.0 TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as the Traffic Control, Parking and Roadways Ordinance as duly advertised and adopted.

3.0 DEFINITIONS AND TERMS

Words and phrases used in this Ordinance shall have the applicable meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania as amended and currently in force except where it clearly indicates a different meaning. The singular shall include the plural and the masculine shall include the feminine.

- 3.1 **Parking**--The leaving of a vehicle unattended for any purpose for any period of time except that the temporary parking of emergency vehicles shall be considered exempt.
- 3.2 **Public Roadway**--Any area of land dedicated as public right-of-way and accepted by the Township Supervisors for the use of vehicular traffic including roads, streets,

lanes and alleys. Placement of all utilities and drainage facilities within the public right-of-way is encouraged.

- 3.3 Roadway Openings--Any activity which requires the cutting or opening of an area within the public right-of-way for the installation or repair of new or existing utilities or facilities.
- 3.4 Through Highway--Those roadway segments within the Municipal boundaries of Daugherty Township designated as Legislative Routes (LR) or State Routes (SR).

4.0 STOPPING AT CERTAIN INTERSECTIONS

The driver of a vehicle shall stop in obedience to a stop sign at an intersection where a stop sign is erected at one or more entrances thereto. Stop signs shall be erected at such street intersections as shall be designated by resolution of the Board of Supervisors. Failure to bring a vehicle to a full stop within a reasonable distance of the intersections designated herein shall constitute a violation of this Ordinance or the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania where applicable and subject the operator of said vehicle to penalties and fines as enumerated in said code or this Ordinance.

- 4.1 From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, all designated LR (Legislative Route) or SR (State Route) roadways are hereby classified as "Through Highways."
- 4.2 It shall be unlawful for the driver or operator of any vehicle, street car, or public transit carrier, except as otherwise provided in the Ordinance, before entering a through highway to fail to come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering the intersection on such through highway, when an official "THRU TRAFFIC STOP" or "STOP" sign or signs have been erected in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.
- 4.3 The driver or operator of any vehicle, street car, or public transit carrier shall not be subject to the provisions of this ordinance during the hours when a traffic signal is actually in operation, or when a state or local police officer is actually on duty directing traffic.
- 4.4 This Ordinance shall not apply to vehicles, when operated with due regard for safety, under the direction of the police in the chase or apprehension of violators of the law or persons charged with or suspected of any violation, nor to fire department or fire patrol vehicles responding to a fire alarm, nor to ambulances when traveling in emergencies. The exemption, however, shall not protect the driver of any such vehicle from the reckless disregard of the safety of others.
- 4.5 The following intersections and or streets located in the Township are hereby declared to be stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are hereby confirmed if heretofore erected), in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street in the direction or directions hereby indicated. All vehicles approaching the intersection upon the first-named street in the direction

or directions hereby indicated in each case shall come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering said intersection:

- (1) Harold Street and Allendale Road.
- (2) Center Street and Main Avenue.
- (3) Center Street and Barker Avenue
- (4) Crescent Heights Place and Main Avenue.
- (5) Pine Street and Wm. Penn Way
- (6) McGuire Street and Stuber Road (north).
- (7) McGuire Street and Stuber Road (south).
- (8) Shanor Drive and Stuber Road.
- (9) Taylor Drive and Stuber Road.
- (10) Woods Drive and Grove Street (north).
- (11) Woods Drive and Grove Street (west).
- (12) Rayz Street and Lynn Drive.
- (13) Lynn Drive and Grove Street (north).
- (14) Lynn Drive and Grove Street (west).
- (15) Daugherty Drive and Craig Street.
- (16) Craig Street and Grove Street.
- (17) Vine Street and North 4th Street.
- (18) Spruce Street and North 4th Street.
- (19) Oak Street and North 4th Street
- (20) Elm Street and North 4th Street.

4.6 The following intersections are hereby declared to be four-way stop intersections and official stop signs shall be erected (or are hereby confirmed if heretofore erected), in such a position as to face traffic approaching the intersection on each named street:

- (1) **Russell Drive and Grove Street.**
- (2) **Woods Drive and Rayz Street.**
- (3) **Russell Drive and Rayz Street.**

4.7 The Daugherty Township Police Department or Pennsylvania State Police shall be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this section.

5.0 STANDING OR UNATTENDED VEHICLES

It shall be unlawful to park or leave standing or unattended for any period of time any motor vehicle or part thereof on or along the public roads, streets, or alleys in Daugherty Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, as described herein, or in such manner as to do damage thereto or interfere with or endanger traffic thereon.

- 5.1 Parking shall be prohibited on all roads and streets in Daugherty Township accepted for maintenance at all times at the following locations where official signs so indicating are erected:**
- a. On both sides of Allendale Road from the point of its intersection with Harold Street to a point 1/8 mile in an easterly and westerly direction along Allendale Road from said point of intersection with Harold Street.**
 - b. On both sides of Crescent Heights Place from its intersection with Main Avenue to its intersection with Mercer Road.**
 - c. On both sides of Main Avenue from its intersection with Crescent Heights Place to Mercer Road.**
 - d. On both sides of North 4th Street from its intersection with North 16th Street (New Brighton Borough) in a westerly direction to the terminus point of North 4th Street.**
 - e. On both sides of Stuber Road for a distance of one hundred (100) feet in a northerly and southerly direction from the entrance to the Daugherty Township Maintenance Building.**
 - f. On both sides of Harold Street in a southerly direction from its intersection with Allendale Road to its terminus point, for a distance of 1,350 feet, more or less.**
 - g. On both sides of Spruce Street in a northerly direction from its intersection with Myrtle Avenue, now known as N. 4th Street, to its terminus point, for a distance of 360 feet, more or less.**
 - h. On both sides of Elm Street in a northerly direction from its intersection with Myrtle Avenue, now known as N. 4th Street, to its terminus point, for a distance of 550 feet, more or less.**
 - i. On both sides of Londonderry Drive, Drumcliff Drive, and Shannon Circle, Daugherty Highlands, plan of lots.**
 - j. On the south side of Main Avenue from its intersection with Pennsylvania Highway Route No. 65 to its intersection with Florence Road.**
 - k. On the north side of North 4th Street from its intersection with Ash Street westwardly to its termination.**
 - l. On the east side of John Street from its intersection with Marion Hill Road northwardly to its termination and on the west side of John Street for a distance of seventy-five (75) feet from its intersection with Marion Hill Road.**
 - m. On the west side of Harold Street from its intersection with Allendale Road southward to its termination.**
 - n. On street parking shall be prohibited on Londonderry Drive, Drumcliff Drive and Shannon Circle.**
 - o. On the south side of North 4th Street from its intersection with Ash Street, westwardly to its termination.**
- 5.2 The Daugherty Township Police Department or Pennsylvania State Police shall be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this section.**

6.0 YIELD INTERSECTIONS

Any vehicle travelling on a street approaching an intersection on which a yield traffic sign has been erected, shall yield the right of way as required by the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

- 6.1 At the intersection of Florence Road and Main Avenue vehicles approaching Main Avenue from Florence Road shall yield to vehicles traveling on Main Avenue, and yield traffic signs shall be erected on Florence Road.
- 6.2 At the intersection of Nelson Avenue and Stuber Road traffic approaching Stuber Road from Nelson Avenue shall yield to traffic traveling on Stuber Road, and yield traffic signs shall be erected on Nelson Avenue.
- 6.3 At the intersection of Grove Street and Daugherty Drive traffic approaching Daugherty Drive from Grove Street shall yield to traffic traveling on Daugherty Drive, and yield traffic signs shall be erected on Grove Street.
- 6.4 At the intersection of Tower Lane and Oldfield Place traffic approaching Oldfield Place from Tower Lane shall yield to traffic traveling on Oldfield Place, and yield traffic signs shall be erected on Tower Lane.
- 6.5 At the intersection of 51st Street and Grove Street traffic approaching Grove Street from 51st Street shall yield to traffic traveling on Grove Street, and yield traffic signs shall be erected on 51st Street.
- 6.6 At the intersection of Ridgevue Road and the south termination of Florence Road traffic approaching Florence Road from Ridgevue Road shall yield to traffic traveling on Florence Road, and yield traffic signs shall be erected on Ridgevue Road.
- 6.7 At the intersection of Tower Lane and Fairfield Drive traffic approaching Fairfield Drive from Tower Lane shall yield to traffic traveling on Fairfield Drive, and yield traffic signs shall be erected on Tower Lane.
- 6.8 At the intersection of Hogue Drive and Inman Drive traffic approaching Inman Drive from Hogue Drive shall yield to traffic traveling on Hogue Drive and yield traffic signs shall be erected on Hogue Drive.
- 6.9 At the intersection of Cardinal Drive and Robin Trail, traffic approaching Cardinal Drive from Robin Trail shall yield to traffic traveling on Cardinal Drive and a yield traffic sign shall be erected on Robin Trail.

7.0 ONE-WAY STREETS

Any vehicle shall be driven on streets hereinafter designated or hereafter designated by resolution as one-way street only in the direction designated by the appropriate one-way street sign.

- 7.1 **Allendale Road shall be a one-way street from its intersection with Pennsylvania State Route No. 68 to its intersection with Pittsburgh Road, and one-way street signs shall be erected on Allendale Road as aforesaid.**

8.0 PUBLIC ROADWAY STANDARDS FOR NEW ROADS AND STREETS

No opening, construction or dedication for public use or travel of any right-of-way, road, street, lane or alley, accepted for maintenance by Daugherty Township, or any drainage facilities in connection therewith shall be permitted, except in accordance with plans submitted and approved by the Board of Supervisors, who shall by regulation prescribe the method of preparing and submitting such plans and the kind and character of improvements to be made.

- 8.1 Construction drawings shall show the profiles of such roads, streets, lane or alleys, the course, structure and capacity of any drainage facilities, the method of drainage of the adjacent or contiguous territory and drainage profile of the streets and plan showing drainage of the whole property; and the size of the lots which shall conform with the zoning and subdivision ordinances of the Township and all amendments thereto. All proposed new roads and street rights-of-way shall be of a width of not less than fifty (50) feet, the cartway shall be not less than twenty-two (22) feet, and all roads and streets connecting with existing streets so as to form a continuation or extension thereof, shall be not less in width than such existing roads and streets. All roads and streets where possible shall connect with existing roads and streets, or proposed roads and streets, so as to form as near as possible through roads and streets, and a harmonious and systematic development of the Township. The names of the roads and streets shall not conflict with the names of existing roads and streets, and all roads and streets shall be designated by the names of existing roads and streets with which they connect as extensions thereof.
- 8.2 All such plans shall be filed with the Township Secretary at least thirty (30) days prior to regular meeting of the Township Supervisors, at which approval is sought. Before acting upon any such plans, the Township Supervisors may, in their discretion, arrange for a public hearing, after giving such notice as they deem desirable in each case. Said plans shall be reviewed and commented upon by the Township Engineer prior to the date of the aforesaid Supervisor's meeting.
- 8.3 The Township Supervisors reserve the right to specify any changes or modifications of any kind which they may deem necessary with respect thereto, based on recommendations of the Township Engineer, and to make their approval of such plans subject to any such alterations, changes or modifications. (See Ordinance #89, Section 5.0)
- 8.4 Any and all plans for public roadways proposed for maintenance by Daugherty Township so approved shall be signed by the Supervisors, and a copy of such plan shall be filed in the Office of the Secretary of the Township, where the same shall be available to public inspection. All roads and streets shown on the said plan shall be

improved in accordance with the plans and specifications prescribed by the Township Supervisors.

- 8.5 All sewers, sewer laterals, and sewer connections shall be laid on all improved or unimproved streets or roadways before paving where connection with a sanitary sewer within Daugherty Township is practicable, and shall be required by the Township Supervisors, and all gas and water mains and all service connections shall be laid before the paving of the street where water and gas is available, and all other mains, pipes and conduits and the like shall be installed before paving of the cartway where it is proposed to install any such service mains within the public right-of-way.
- 8.6 All applications for the approval of such plans shall be in writing on a form provided by Daugherty Township, and signed by the owners of the property, which must be filed with the Secretary of the Township, setting forth in detail the character of the improvements to be made on the property shown on the said plan, in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, and in such application the applicant shall agree to open, lay out and improve the roads, streets, lanes or alleys, and to construct all of the improvements, including sewers and drainage facilities upon the property, shown on the plan, within the time or times therein specified, and agree to enter into a contract in writing prepared by the Township Solicitor, to install, erect and construct the said improvements. In addition, the applicant shall furnish a signature block setting forth the name or names of the owner or owners of all property covered by such plans and shall show and shall contain a list of all mortgages, judgments, liens, easements, contracts and agreements of records in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds in and for Beaver County, Pennsylvania, which shall affect the property covered by such plans. If such recorded information shall disclose that any such property shall be subject to any mortgage, judgment, easement, lien, contract or agreement, or any other matters of record, then at the option of the Township Supervisors, the holders or owners of such mortgages, judgments, liens, easements, contracts or agreements shall be required to join in and approve said applications before the same shall be acted upon the Township Supervisors. The applicant shall furnish a surety in such amount, under such conditions and form, and with surety as shall be approved by the Township Supervisors, to guarantee the performance of the said contract and to secure the completion of the said improvements with the times therein specified. In lieu of a bond, the applicant may deposit cash to guarantee performance of said contract or execute an irrevocable letter of credit in the Township Supervisor's names, or to secure completion of the improvements upon an escrow agreement to be prepared by the Township Solicitor and approved by the Township Supervisors.
- 8.7 All applicants shall bear all costs of inspection of such roads, streets, lanes or alleys, and shall deposit with the Township Treasurer such sum as the Township Supervisors shall determine to guarantee payment of such costs.
- 8.8 No action by the Township Supervisors shall be construed to require the Township to accept dedication of any road, street, lane or alley.

9.0 OBSTRUCTIONS PROHIBITED

The obstruction of public roadways, drainageways or bridges is unlawful and for the purpose of this Section is construed to include, but is not limited to the following:

- 9.1 Any person or persons who erect or construct any obstruction of any kind whatsoever, whether the same be by placing anything above the surface, or by digging a ditch, entrance or exit for a walk or driveway, with or without pipe or other drain incident thereto, or other excavation of any kind in, on, or under any road, sidewalk, footwalk, culvert, drain, bridge, or the slope, berm or abutment adjacent thereto, so as to interfere temporarily or permanently with the convenient or practical use of said road, sidewalk, footwalk, culvert, drain, bridge, or the slope, berm or abutment adjacent thereto within the Township of Daugherty.
- 9.2 Any person or persons who desire to erect or construct any temporary obstruction as above set forth shall first obtain from the Secretary of the Board of Supervisors of Daugherty Township a permit therefore for which, he, she, or they shall pay a fee set by the Board of Supervisors and in addition thereto deposit with the Secretary of the Board of Supervisors a sum of money set by the Board of Supervisors to guarantee said obstruction will be removed and the road, sidewalk, footwalk, culvert, drain, bridge, or the slope, berm or abutment adjacent thereto or anything else disturbed or interfered with by said obstruction or construction shall be restored to its original condition or to the satisfaction of the Board of Supervisors. Thereupon said sum of a fee set by the Board of Supervisors shall be returned to the depositor thereof; otherwise, this sum shall be retained by the Township to recover expenses incurred to restore the area of the temporary obstruction to its original condition.
- 9.3 The Daugherty Township Police Department or Pennsylvania State Police shall be responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of this Section.

10.0 ROAD OPENING PERMIT

No township public roadways of the Township of Daugherty shall be opened or cut by any person, firm, corporation or utility without first securing a permit in accordance with the following provisions:

- 10.1 Permit to be secured from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation on state roads.
- 10.2 In accordance with the provisions of Section 1156 of Article XI of the Second Class Township Code, as amended, no railroad or street railway shall hereafter be constructed upon any township road, nor shall any railroad or street railway crossings, nor any gas pipe, water pipe, electric conduits, or other piping, be laid upon or in, nor shall any telephone, telegraph, cable T. V. or electric light or power poles, or any coal tipples or any other obstructions be erected upon or in, any portion of a public roadway except under such conditions, restrictions and regulations relating to the installation and maintenance thereof, as follows:
 - a. Deposit. (Form of Deposit as approved by the Township Solicitor and the amount to be set by the Township Engineer) Applicant shall deposit with the

Township Secretary prior to obtaining a permit a sum which shall be the greater of the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars or the current prevailing cost of repair or replacement as determined by the Township Engineer. The deposit shall be paid at the time the permit is received, and the deposit shall be used to reimburse the Township for the cost of any work and/or materials furnished by it in the event the permittee fails to restore the opening properly according to the Township specifications. The Township shall waive this requirement insofar as it pertains to a public utility company if such company files with the Township its corporate bond or other surety in a form satisfactory to the Township Solicitor, conditioned upon the payment to the Township of all costs which would otherwise be covered by and paid out of such a deposit. In the event any public utility company elects to file such a bond, the Township shall bill such company monthly for such costs as they accrue or they shall be paid at the time of securing each permit.

- b. Form of Deposit. The deposit may be either in the form of a certified, treasurer's or cashier's check or in lawful money of the United States.
 - c. Insufficient Deposit. If any deposit is less than sufficient to pay all costs, the permittee shall, upon demand, pay to the Township an amount equal to the deficiency. If the permittee fails or refuses to pay such deficiency, the Township may institute an action to recover the same in any court of competent jurisdiction. Until such deficiency is paid in full, no additional permits shall be issued to such permittee.
 - d. Yearly Deposit. Whenever any public utility or municipal authority, if it does not elect to file a corporate bond as provided in Subsection (a) of this Article, shall anticipate more than one street opening or excavation per calendar year, such public utility or municipal authority may post one deposit in an amount and form as provided herein for the calendar year or part thereof to cover the cost of any and all work.
 - e. Refund of Deposit. Upon notification by the permittee that all work authorized by the permit has been completed, and after verification that satisfactory restoration of the opening has occurred, the Township Secretary shall refund to the permittee his deposit less all costs incurred by the Township in connection with said permit. In no event shall the permit fee be refunded.
- 10.3 The application for a permit shall be on a form prescribed by the Township and submitted to the Township in triplicate. The application shall be accompanied by a fee in accordance with the Schedule of Fees set forth by the Daugherty Township Board of Supervisors. In addition, the applicant shall submit three (3) copies of a sketch showing such dimensions as the location of the intended facility, width of the traveled roadway, right-of-way lines and a dimension to the nearest intersecting street.
- 10.4 A permit shall be issued to the applicant after all the aforementioned requirements have been filed.
- 10.5 Upon completion of the work authorized by the Roadway Opening Permit, the applicant shall give written notice thereof to the Township whereupon the Township

Engineer shall inspect the work and, when necessary recommend the further compliance of conditions, restrictions and regulations prescribed by the permit. Where any settlement or defect in the work occurs, if the applicant shall fail to rectify any such settlement or other defect, within sixty (60) days after written notice from the Township to do so, the Township may do the work and shall impose upon the applicant all costs associated therewith plus an additional twenty percent (20%) of such costs for administrative expenses.

10.6 Enforcement of these provisions shall be the responsibility of the Daugherty Township Police Department or the Zoning and Codes Officer.

11.0 SPECIAL POWERS OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE

The Chief of Police of the Township of Daugherty shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in times of emergency:

- a. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and parking regulations.
- b. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works or in the case of the conduct of processions and public event, to restrict or prohibit parking or traffic in limited areas for periods of not more than twenty-four (24) hours.
- c. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate a vehicle in violation of any such regulation shall be liable to the penalty set forth in the law for such violation.
- d. The Chief of Police shall further have the power and authority to establish, change and abolish, and to designate by appropriate marking or signs, crosswalks, traffic lanes and parking spaces.

12.0 PERMANENT REGULATIONS

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances or as parts of ordinances or as amendments to ordinances of the Township of Daugherty.

- a. **PARKING.** It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle upon the side of any street where a properly posted no parking sign is erected. Official signs prohibiting parking shall be erected upon the sides of such streets as shall be designated by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.
- b. **ONE-WAY STREETS.** No person shall operate a vehicle on any street or portion thereof which is properly posted as a one-way street other than in the direction established by such posting. Such streets shall be designated as one-way streets and official signs erected thereon as are established by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.
- c. **SPEED LIMITS.** Speed limits may be established from time to time upon streets and alleys in the Township by resolution of the Board of Supervisors. Upon such designation, official signs shall be erected upon such streets and alleys so designated with speed limits. Minimum engineering studies as deter-

mined by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation shall be the standard used.

- d. LOAD LIMITS. The maximum weight of vehicles using the streets and alleys in the Township shall be as designated from time to time by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.
- e. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS. The Board of Supervisors may, from time to time, establish certain regulations regarding the use of streets and alleys in the Township by vehicles and provide penalties for violation thereof.

13.0 ENFORCEMENT REMEDIES

The following procedures and minimum fines are hereby established:

- a. Failure to stop at certain intersections - Upon conviction of a summary offense by the Magistrate having jurisdiction, an operator of a vehicle violating Section 4.0 of this Ordinance shall pay a minimum fine of twenty-five (\$25) dollars plus all filing and court costs.
- b. Parking Violations - Any person parking upon streets so designated as prohibited for parking or owners of a vehicle so parked shall pay a minimum fine of fifteen (\$15.00) dollars plus all filing and court costs, upon conviction of a summary offense by the Magistrate having jurisdiction.
- c. Obstructions - Any person, firm, corporation or utility convicted of a summary offense in violation of Section 9.0 of this Ordinance shall pay a minimum fine of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars plus all filing and court costs.
- d. Violation of Roadway Opening Provisions - Any person, firm, utility or corporation convicted of a summary offense in violation of Section 10.0 of this Ordinance shall pay a minimum fine of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars per day for each day that the violation exists, plus all filing and court costs.
- e. Violation of One Way Street Regulations - Any person operating a vehicle in violation of Section 7.0, shall upon summary conviction by a magistrate having jurisdiction, pay a minimum fine of fifty (\$50.00) dollars plus all court costs and filing fees.
- f. Violation of Yield Intersection - Any person operating a vehicle in violation of Section 6.0, shall upon summary conviction by a magistrate having jurisdiction, pay a minimum fine of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars plus all court costs and filing fees.

13.1 Notice of Violation

In the case of non-traffic offenses, notice by certified mail of violation shall be forwarded to the person, firm, corporation or utility of violation of the provisions of this Ordinance so identified in the notice by the Township Zoning and Codes Officer or duly authorized personnel. Said notice shall state a deadline for compliance and describe the nature of the violation.

14.0 SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this ordinance shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional or illegal, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. It is hereby declared as a legislative intent that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional or illegal provision not been included herein.

15.0 ENACTMENT AND EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the Daugherty Township Board of Supervisors.
